Dear Parent or Guardian:

Heartland AEA will conduct hearing screenings this school year for kindergarten through 2nd grade and 5th grade students.

We encourage you to watch a 2½ minute video with your younger student showing what we do during a hearing screening. The video can be found at: <u>https://youtu.be/gaHiry9D7Jg</u>. It will help your student know what to expect when it's their turn to play the listening game!

Students who do not pass this initial screening may receive a recheck by the audiologist at school at a later date. Parents will be notified about the results only if the audiologist has a concern after recheck. This is a screening program and does not identify all hearing or ear problems. If your student has recently had hearing or ear problems, feel free to send this information to the school nurse to share with the audiologist.


If you do not want your student to receive a hearing screening, please notify the school. If there are any questions about the hearing screening program in your school, please contact your school nurse or principal.

<u>Centennial Elementary Cold Weather</u> <u>Recess Guidelines</u>

Parents, with cold weather and snow just around the corner I thought it'd be good to review our outdoor recess guidelines.

All students are required to go out for recess unless they have a note from the doctor. Rule of thumb is if they are healthy enough to be at school they should be well enough to attend recess.

The information below is based on the temperature at recess time, so if there is achange in the weather/temperatures, the flag color can change at any time during the day from morning, lunch, or afternoon recesses.

Green Flag :Full outdoor recess: wind chill temperatures greater or equal to 15 degrees or above (25min.for grades K-1st &30 min. 2nd -5th

lunch recess.)

Red Flag: No outdoor recess if wind chill temperatures less or equal to 14 degrees or it's raining or snowing.

Please make sure your child dresses for the cold and wears a winter coat, hat, and gloves. Snow boots and pants are required to play in the snow and if not worn your child will be limited to the black top playground area. If your child walks to school, it is very important they understand the importance of dressing warm and keeping exposed skin areas covered since cold weather emergencies such as frostbite and hypothermia can set in quickly if not prepared.

Parents of pre-school students: Teachers follow the same temperature guidelines with a 20-minute recess.

Shorts and Sandals/flip flops: Our guidelines for wearing shorts and sandals to school are wind chill temps of 50 degrees or above . Iunderstand some like to wear shorts for PE which is fine as long as they wear long pants until and as well after PE.
