

Leaderin Me.

Readers are Leaders!

Reading and understanding what you read is a skill that everyone needs to be successful. The best way to improve understanding is to read a lot. There is nothing like a challenging book to lift you up or take you to another world. Developing a love of reading will be an asset to your student in all areas of school and will give them a jumpstart to a lifetime of reading!

Integrating the habits into a part of your family's life can be fun and exciting, using books they enjoy. Below are some suggestions of how to engage with books.

LOWER ELEMENTARY (PREK-3)

Read the book together. Ask your students questions about how the characters used the habits.

UPPER ELEMENTARY (4-6)

Your student reads the book to you. Ask questions about how the characters use the habits.

SECONDARY (7-12)

Encourage students to engage in conversations and connections to what they are reading and the habits.

Sample questions that you can ask during reading include:

- · Was the main character proactive or reactive? How do you know?
- What examples of synergy (working together) did you see in this book?
- What was the conflict/problem in the book? Did the characters use a win-win attitude? Why or why not?
- · What was the main character's end in mind?

Make reading a family affair!

- Set a regular time that works for everyone (even just 15 minutes) where each member of the family can engage in a fun book.
- · Create a cozy, relaxing environment that encourages reading.
- · Store books in a visible location at home.
- Talk to your student about what you're reading, both for work and personal life.

Centennial Elementary Cold Weather Recess Guidelines

Parents, with cold weather and snow just around the corner I thought it'd be good to review our outdoor recess guidelines.

All students are required to go out for recess unless they have a note from the doctor. Rule of thumb is if they are healthy enough to be at school they should be well enough to attend recess.

The information below is based on the temperature at recess time, so if there is a change in the weather/temperatures, the flag color can change at any time during the day from morning, lunch, or afternoon recesses.

Green Flag: Full outdoor recess: wind chill temperatures greater or equal to **15 degrees or above** (25min.for grades K-1st & 30 min. 2nd - 5th lunch recess.)

Red Flag: No outdoor recess if wind chill temperatures less or equal to 14 degrees or it's raining or snowing.

Please make sure your child dresses for the cold and wears a winter coat, hat, and gloves. Snow boots and pants are required to play in the snow and if not worn your child will be limited to the black top playground area.

If your child walks to school, it is very important they understand the importance of dressing warm and keeping exposed skin areas covered since cold weather emergencies such as frost bite and hypothermia can set in quickly if not prepared.

<u>Parents of pre-school students:</u> Teachers follow the same temperature guidelines with a 20-minute recess.

Shorts and Sandals/flip flops: Our guidelines for wearing shorts and sandals to school are wind chill temps of 50 degrees or above. I understand some like to wear shorts for PE which is fine as long as they wear long pants until and as well after PE.

3. Once logged in, select Meal Payments.



7. When all items are in your cart click Checkout.



- 8. Verify information for accuracy and select "Complete Order"
- Payment will be processed and Receipt can be viewed and printed. Credit card statements will show payment made to the school district.

Payments may take up to 30 minutes to be transferred to your child(ren)'s accounts. Payments made close to meal service time may not be available in their accounts. Student's without sufficient funds will not be able to purchase a la carte items
