

ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

Did you know that poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by the end of third grade?

One of our goals this year is to decrease the number of Delaware PK-5th grade students who are chronically absent and increase awareness of attendance and why it is so important. Missing 18 or more days a year is considered to be chronically absent. Last school year 23% of our students were chronically absent.

Throughout the school year, we will be highlighting the importance of school attendance as well as engaging families in conversations to identify barriers, and seek solutions as we strive to meet our goals!
